- 9. * **Request for Temporary Sidewalk for Campus Life Center Project** Oxford College is seeking approval from Council to construct temporary concrete sidewalks in the Pierce Street and Wesley Street right-of-way. The sidewalks will help with pedestrian flow while the intersection is closed during the construction of the new Campus Life Center. We have attached the site plan.
- 10. **107 W. Clark Street Renovation Project** The *ad hoc* Yarbrough House Renovation Committee will report on the progress of the 107 W. Clark Street Renovation Project.
- 11. * **810 Whatcoat Lease with Oxford College** Oxford College has expressed interest in continuing to lease the building located at 810 Whatcoat Street. Per the lease, the college will occupy the building until March 2021. They have agreed to the terms listed in the attached lease.
- 12. * Asbury Street Park Playground and Surfacing We received two proposals for the playground equipment and surfacing for Asbury Street Park. The contract for the playground equipment and surfacing is separate from the contract Council awarded to HCS Services, LLC to construct the park. We have attached the proposals from GameTime and Kompan.

- 13. * Change Order for Asbury Street Park When preparing the soil for the park, the contractor unearthed a large pit filled with refuse. The contractor had to excavate and dispose of the garbage and unsuitable soil and import fill dirt in excess of what was originally planned. We have attached the change order for this work.
- 14. **Discussion on City Finances** Financial Sustainability was the focus of the recent Council Retreat. Mayor will appoint a committee to research and report on city revenue and expense by line item. The report will contain current and future financial data. The report will be completed by February 28, 2019.
- 15. **Finance** We will need to review the total cash in the General Operating Account for month end October and authorize the City Clerk/Treasurer to transfer cash to a designated fund. Amount and fund to be determined by Council.

We will need to discuss Verizon Lease revenue.

16. **Planning Commission Appointments** – Jonathan Eady and Juanita Carson will end their terms as members of the Planning Commission at the end of this year.
