OXFORD PLANNING COMMISSION

Minutes - May 9, 2017

OPENING: At 7:09 PM, Mr. Eady called the meeting to order and welcomed Ms. Mayfield.

APPROVAL OF MIMUTES: Upon motion of Mr. Manson, seconded by Mr. Wearing, the minutes for the meeting of April 11, 2017 were approved. The vote was 5-0.

OXFORD COLLEGE REZONING REQUEST — Oxford College submitted a request to rezone two lots (805 Whatcoat Street and 107 George Street) from R-20 to TC (Town Center). The purpose is to construct a parking lot.

Mr. Schwartz noted that he had distributed to the Planning Commission copies of an email from May 5th from Councilmember Eady concerning this issue.

The Commission members had an extended discussion concerning the rezoning request for the two lots both together and individually. They reviewed the "Criteria for Amendments to Official Zoning Map" found in §40-638 (g) of the Zoning Ordinance.

On a suggestion from the Planning Commission Ms. Mayfield amended the requested zone from TC to "Institutional". She noted that if she returned with a Development Permit request, the design would include a fence to shield the adjacent residential property.

Upon motion of Mr. Manson, seconded by Mr. Wearing the Planning Commission recommends that 805 George Street be rezoned from "R-20" to "Institutional". Further, that 107 George Street be rezoned from "R-20" to "Institutional" conditioned upon the retention of the existing use and that the parking not exceed the area shown on a plan submitted by Oxford College on May 9, 2017. The vote was 4 – 0 with Mr. Eady abstaining.

A copy of the plan submitted by the College is attached to these minutes.

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CITY REPORT – Mr. Schwartz reported on the recruitment for a new city manager and on the status of a couple of construction projects.

ADJOURNMENT: Mr. Eady adjourned the meeting at 8:25 PM.

Re: E. Clark Street Extension Contractor

Dear Mr. Pepper:

I have reviewed three bids received by the City for the East Clark Street Extension project. If the council chooses to proceed with construction, I recommend that low bidder, HCS Services, be selected to perform the E. Clark Street Extension improvements for the amount of \$281,000. HCS Services has recently provided me proof of insurance and has a good reputation with the City's superintendent, who is familiar with his work. In my opinion, HCS performed well in building the George Street Park drainage improvements in Oxford last year. HCS's proposed subcontractor for curb and paving is Southland Paving Company, LLC, the same subcontractor that was proposed by the second lowest bidder. I am somewhat familiar with Southland Paving and know them to be a reputable contractor. I'm not familiar with the proposed grading subcontractor, F.E. Clearing and Grading.

As a point of clarification, there was a \$3500 math error in the bid summary page submitted by HCS Services. The sum of each of the sub-items totaled \$3500 more than the bottom line number he provided. Mr. Stewart of HCS gave me verbal assurance that he is prepared to enter into a contract for the lower of the two numbers, \$281,000, the number entered into the bottom line on his proposal. I consider this a minor irregularity that will not affect the contracting process or the project.

In June, the City of Oxford put out a bid to extend the walking trail on the unopened portion of the George Street right-of-way. HCS Services was the lowest bidder for the project at \$211,000. We revisited the project to realize potential cost-savings. For instance, we reduced the width of the trail from ten feet to eight feet. We also contracted for a prefabricated aluminum bridge, which is lighter weight and has smaller piers. With the new specifications, the city renegotiated with HCS Services for a second quote. The quote came in at \$187,500.

Subject: Annual Subscription for Supplemental Power

Once again it is time for the annual subscription process for supplemental power supply. Attached is your ten-year supplemental power supply estimates based on the latest load forecast and the Year 2018 Annual Subscription Form for Supplemental Power.

After reviewing this information, please nominate your supplemental power supply alternative and return to MEAG Power by October 2, 2017. Otherwise, it will be assumed that you want to purchase your supplemental energy needs (excluding reserves) in the hourly market.

Under the Supplemental Power Policy there are three alternatives. The first alternative (i) is for a Participant to nominate MEAG Power to act as its agent to acquire the necessary resources to fulfill its supplemental power supply requirements. The second alternative (ii) is to purchase in either the monthly or medium term market. The medium term market is from one to five years and can be used for base or peaking load. TEA has not provided any prices for the medium term market beyond one year due to the inability to get meaningful prices at this time. They have estimated the price ranges for the other alternatives, and these estimates are provided on the attached nominating form. These prices are only estimates and are subject to change. However, we are providing this to you as a benchmark to assist in your decision making process. The third alternative (iii) is for a Participant to acquire the necessary resources itself for 2018.

MEAG Power and TEA will continue to monitor opportunities that benefit the Participants. If those opportunities are confirmed, an unscheduled nomination opportunity will be presented to you at that time.

Also, you will notice on the nomination form that we are asking for Participants who have excess capacity for reserves if they are interested in selling it (v). The price estimates have again been provided by TEA.

Please remember that each Participant is required to carry 15% capacity reserves. If the staff determines that a Participant is not carrying sufficient reserves, we have the responsibility to purchase reserves to fulfill the requirement. The costs would be allocated back to the Participants based on their shortfall of the reserve requirement.
