A motion was approved at the March 7, 2011 Mayor and Council Regular Session to amend the 2011 budget to provide \$20,000 for Art Work for the New City Hall. After further review and discussion it has been decided to put this project on hold and add the \$20,000 for this project to the new 2011/2012 budget in July.

The Department of Transportation has approved the Highway 81 paving project. The project will begin at the Quick Trip in Covington and extend north of the city. The city is responsible for lowering and raising any manholes and water valves.

The city received a letter from the Home Owners Association at Victoria Station for consideration of a refund of the \$3,212.02 in electric bills they paid to Georgia Power for the sewer pump that belongs to the city.

Smith expressed concern that the city replaced the pump and it may be during a period of time in which the property had not been dedicated to the city. If it has not been dedicated based on the date structure it would not be the city's liability. He suggested the city review the final plat to determine when the city bought the pump and make the necessary adjustments.
